#### Kristine B. Hopkins O.D., MSPH, FAAO

Dr. Kristine Hopkins is a Professor and Associate Dean at the UAB School of Optometry specializing in pediatric vision and binocular anomalies. Dr. Hopkins completed her masters of science in public health and her doctor of optometry degrees at UAB and her residency in Pediatrics and Binocular Vision at the Southern California College of Optometry. She is the founder and chief of the Vision Therapy Clinic at the school.Dr. Hopkins has been an investigator for the Pediatric Eye Disease Investigator Group since 1999 contributing to over a dozen Amblyopia Treatment Trials and leading an Esotropia Treatment Study. Dr. Hopkins has also served as a principle investigator for the NIH/NEI funded Convergence Insufficiency Treatment Trial (CITT) and the CITT-Attention and Reading Trial at UAB. Dr. Hopkins' research interests include amblyopia, convergence insufficiency, strabismus, pediatric vision, and vision therapy, Dr. Hopkins is a diplomate of the American Academy of Optometry in Binocular Vision, Perception, and Pediatric Optometry and serves as a consultant for the National Board of Examiners in Optometry.



#### Robert P. Woolridge, O.D., FAAO

Dr. Wooldridge is the Director of The Eye Foundation of Utah, an optometric co-management center in Salt Lake City, Utah. A graduate of the Indiana School of Optometry, he formerly served on the staff of the Bascom Palmer Eve Institute, University of Miami School of Medicine.Dr. Wooldridge is a founding member of the Optometric Glaucoma Society and a Fellow in the American Academy of Optometry, He has served as President of the Utah Optometric Association, four terms as President and Education Director of the Mountain West Council of Optometrists and as a Director of the Great Western Council of Optometry. He is Chairman of the Utah State Board of Optometry, Department of Professional Licensing. As Adjunct Clinical Instructor at several schools and colleges of optometry over decades, he has directed the clinical education of optometry students from across the U.S. and Canada. He is a twotime recipient of the Utah Optometrist of the Year award and serves as the UOA Education Committee Chairman. A nationally known speaker, he has provided lectures over the past thirty years to optometrists across the U.S. and internationally.



#### Melanie Denton Dombrowski, O.D., MBA, MAA

Dr. Denton graduated with a BS in Anthropology-Zoology in 2005 from University of Michigan. Following her undergraduate studies, she attended the Michigan College of Optometry, obtaining her doctorate in optometry in 2009. Dr. Denton completed her student internships at the Duke Eye Center, the Detroit Veteran's Affairs Hospital, and the Optometric Institute and Clinic of Detroit, Following graduation, she elected to pursue an Ocular Disease residency program and was selected to be a resident at the prestigious Bascom Palmer Eve Institute in Miami, FL, where she completed her residency. While living in Asheville, she completed an MBA from Western Carolina University. She is a member of the Historic Salisbury Foundation, the Rowan Chamber of Commerce, and the Salisbury Rotary. She volunteers as a clinical examiner for the North Carolina Board of Optometry as well as being a member of the North Carolina Optometric Society, the American Optometric Association, and a fellow of the American Academy of Optometry.
